

CFCM'S 2020 ACTIVITY

Introduction

CFCM activities were slow owing to COVID-19 and the restriction on social events. This report presents progress and achievements on project implementation.

Implementation of activities

Welfare to the Pro poor

Due to the covid 19 pandemic very little home to home visit were made to reach the pro poor in the rural communities. However, very few of the pro poor were reached in Sankor and Hweda communities.

Mission and evangelism

Very few mission volunteers were engaged to reach Hweda, Obiri, Amanful, Fawomanye and Sankor for church planting and construction of church buildings.



Medical Missions

Much of the mission's activities were focused on developing the Coast for Christ hospital in response to the Covid 19 pandemic. Some PPEs were acquired and protocols as specified by Ghana Health Services and the World Health Organization were strictly adhered to as CFCM carried out her medical mission in Sankor and Winneba communities.



Evangelism and Missions outreach

Due to the covid 19 pandemic, evangelism and missions outreach were not carried out. Rather, Katanka communication centre accorded Coast for Christ ministries free airtime to disseminate information on improving quality of life. The dissemination of Coast for Christ ministries' messages took the form of announcement and daily development messages on improving quality of life.

Educating the Young

Coast for Christ Academy of the Coast for Christ ministries continued to give formal education to the young and scholarships to poor but intelligent children in Sankor and Winneba communities.



Challenges

Developments in 2020 brought to light the need to diversify the delivery methods of our interventions which until the onset of COVID-19 was mainly physical meetings in groups. The diversification calls for logistical arrangements that will not have the desired effectiveness in the short term especially reaching out to our primary target group.

Conclusions

Coast for Christ ministries operated throughout the year 2020 with the quality of life of beneficiaries improving though CFCM was facing Covid 19 challenges.
